

## News Headlines

- The Biden Administration continues its negotiations with Republicans over a \$1.7T infrastructure package. A major sticking point that remains is a disagreement over how to fund the package.
- The Equal Employment Opportunity Commission issued guidance saying that Federal laws don't prevent an employer from requiring workers to be vaccinated prior to returning to the workplace.
- China has indicated that it will now allow all married couples to have up to 3 children. This comes as a recent census report showed a sharp increase in the percentage of Chinese aged 60 and above.

## Economic News

- Private-sector wages were up 1.1% in April and are now up 19.4% from a year ago, and are up 5.5% over the February 2020 pre-pandemic level.
- Consumer prices rose 0.6% in April and are up 3.6% year-over-year, while core prices (which exclude energy and food) rose 0.7% in April and are up 3.1% year-over-year.
- The Commerce Department announced that the median price of a new home sold in April was \$374,400, up 20.1% from a year earlier, which is the strongest annual gain since 1988.

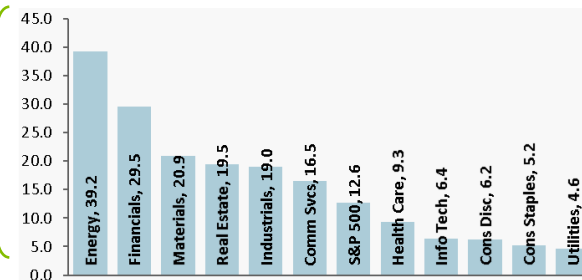
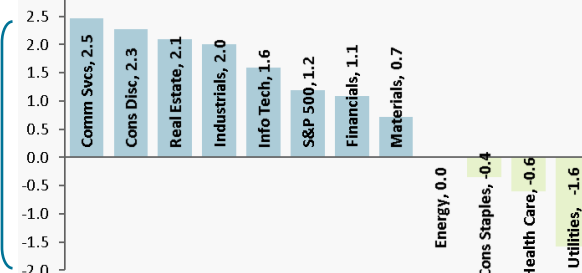

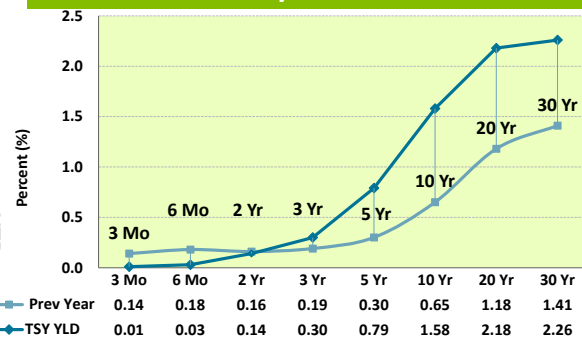
